PIKE ROAD, Ala – Fire ants plague backyards, pastures and everywhere in between in Central Alabama. Aside from building unsightly mounds in outdoor spaces, fire ant bites can get in the way of summer activities, and can even be dangerous for those with ant allergies. The Town of Pike Road's Agriculture and Stewardship Club 2018 Seminar Series continues Thursday, May 17 at 9 a.m. at Pike Road Town Hall (9575 Vaughn Rd) with the information you need to manage these pests and take control of your outdoor spaces.

Dr. Chip East, Regional Field Agent of the Alabama Cooperative Extension System, will lead the May 17 Fire Ant Management seminar, speaking about fire ant biology, management options, and more. This seminar offers a timely opportunity for homeowners and landowners to clean up their lawns and prepare their outdoor spaces for summer fun.
