

If you are familiar with the Pike Road area,
you might already know what a special
place the Grace Episcopal Church is. Did you
know it is an historic location? The
Carpenter Gothic structure was built in 1892.
The building was placed on the Alabama

Register of Landmarks and Heritage on January 29, 1980, and the National Register of Historic Places on February 19, 1982. It is a favorite destination for artists and this show is dedicated to the art Grace has inspired.

Ag & Stewardship Club Tackles Water Runoff: Rain Gardens Bring Beauty, Function to Landscapes



Thank you to everyone who joined us this morning at the Pike Road Ag, Recreation & Performing Arts Center for our <u>Rain Gardens</u> workshop!

We had a great morning with Laura Bell, Project Manager with the Extension Water Program, Auburn Univ. Water Resources Center, learning all about rain gardens.

So, what are rain gardens? Whether small or large, rain gardens are a beautiful and

functional part of stormwater management, slowing water for a short time to encourage infiltration into the soil. This helps filter out pollutants, combat erosion and encourage native plants! Rain gardens are more important than ever as our landscapes experience development, increasing impervious surfaces like concrete and rooftops in places that once held soil and vegetation. Water and pollutants run over these hard surfaces and into our waterways.

Using native plants can help make your rain garden nearly maintenance-free, as they are biologically designed to thrive in our climate. Native grasses will help reduce weeds.

When evaluating a potential rain garden site, try to be 10 feet away from building foundations, 3 feet from a sidewalk, never on top of a septic system drain field and never

install uphill. Alabama 811 is a great resource to check potential sites for utilities because rain gardens require deep beds. Drill a two-foot deep hole in to test your site, fill it with water, and wait an hour to see where the water level is. Ideally, it should soak into the ground at about one inch per hour.
