or more than 200 years now, residents have been choosing to call Pike Road home. The leaders who toiled to bring about the town's incorporation in 1997 knew that for many of those residents. quality of life was a major factor influencing their location decision. That is why, when they identified what we know as the town's Four Pillars, quality of life was included. In the two decades since our incorporation, we have been working to ensure that, with every decision we make, we are preserving and building upon the exceptional quality of life for which Pike Road is known.

Recent Accomplishments

 Parts of the natural trail available for use by community members on Meriwether Road and the trailhead at Founder's Station are complete with

- handicap-accessible parking, restrooms and a picnic pavilion. Parts of the Marler Road Trail are also open to the public.
- The mural wall, a collaborative art project begun in October 2015 to commemorate the birthday of Pike Road, was finished in the summer of 2016.

Public Services

n addition to enjoying great quality of life, residents of the Town of Pike Road benefit from the uncommon arrangement the town's founders established for the provision of public services. Wanting to ensure that residents enjoyed top-notch public services without the associated administrative costs, Pike Road's early leaders arranged for those services to be provided through partnerships with various public and private entities. Thanks to excellent relationships built over two decades of working with these partners, Pike Road residents receive top-notch essential services.

Recent Accomplishments

- The opening of the first leg of the Outer Loop in 2016 connected I-85 and Vaughn Road.
- The Town of Pike Road solidified its longstanding committment of support to our

- volunteer fire departments by allocating 5 mills of the municipal ad valorem tax to help fund the organizations.
- Recycling resources for Pike Road residents were upgraded to newer, mobile receptacles with the capabiility to recycle plastic in 2015.

The rapidly changing I landscape of east Montgomery County was one of the driving forces behind the movement to incorporate the Town of Pike Road in the late 1990s, and wise planning has been core to our vision and mission ever since. While growth is expected, we strive to shape that growth by combining citizen input and professional expertise, and create an environment that will continue to be desirable to individuals and families for generations to come.

The Pike Road Consolidated School was the first in Montgomery County to teach grades 1-12 in one facility. It opened in November 1918.

99 years later in 2017, the school will reopen as a secondary campus of the Pike Road Schools system.

Education

From the earliest days as a rural farming community, Pike Road people have understood the value of education and the sense of pride and unity a local school can generate. That is why residents established the original Pike Road Consolidated School in 1918 and why, nearly a century later, another generation worked tirelessly to lay the groundwork for the Pike Road School System that opened in the fall of 2015.

Though a separate entity from the school system. the Town understands the school's importance to the community and supports the high-quality, hometown public education through revenue, capital investments and other efforts. Since 2006 when the idea took flight, Town leadership fought alongside passionate citizens to organize community meetings, engage national consultants in strategic plans, conduct a census count and provide legal assistance for Pike Road Schools. The Town of Pike

Road is proud of the school system's success and is pleased to be the primary investor in the education of the community's young people.



/e congratulate our We congratulate out first superintendent, Dr. Suzanne Freeman, on her retirement from the system and thank her for her leadership in helping to establish Pike Road Schools. Moving a school system from separation through the initial years of operation is a difficult task that has been accomplished with success. Under Dr. Freeman's leadership, a dynamic team of lead learners is implementing innovative and award-winning educational programs. Thank you, Dr. Freeman for your dedication to Pike Road's young people.

Fiscal Efficiency

hough it's not one of our Four Pillars, it's important to emphasize that the Town of Pike Road has done an outstanding job of managing financial resources since its incorporation. During preparations to issue the bond that would finance the school, the town was awarded an AA+ rating, virtually unheardof for a less than 20-year-old municipality. The Town of Pike Road maintained its excellent credit rating after its recent review, due, at least in part, to the fact that town leaders committed in 2013 to maintain a 10 percent operating reserve at all times. This is the largest reserve fund held by any Alabama municipality, and it positions the town to weather difficulties smoothly—something gravely important in uncertain times and will greatly benefit future generations of town leaders and residents.

The following excerpts from audited financial reports by Jackson Thornton & Co., P.C., highlight recent town financial activity.

Performance of town funds

At the end of the 2015 fiscal year, the Town's governmental funds reported a combined fund balance of \$10.9 million, which includes \$7.8 million restricted fund balances to be used for capital improvements, school facilities construction, emergency services, and debt service; \$425,000 in assigned fund balances to be used for various capital projects, \$19,000 in non-spendable fund balances, and \$2.6 million of unassigned General Funds available for future needs.

Budgetary highlights of the General Fund

At the beginning of each fiscal year, the Mayor prepares and submits an annual budget to be considered and adopted by the Town Council. The 2015 fiscal year budget was adopted in November 2014. The town's actual results as compared to the town's budget can be briefly summarized as follows:

Town of Pike Road & Pike Road Schools

With Education as one of four Pillars identified by Pike Road citizens, the Town is dedicated to supporting our community school system and is thankful for the opportunity to contribute to the education of young people in Pike Road.

For these reasons, the Town of Pike Road has committed more than \$29 million support to the school's construction and capital projects and has provided more than \$4.5 million of support for operational funding. The Town is pleased to have arranged and paid for land and construction sufficient to provide for two campuses, making PRS one of the only systems in Alabama without any construction debt.

On the Horizon:

A third construction project to provide added classroom space is being pushed forward, and construction has begun on the Patriot Park recreation and educational facility. This park will include both athletic and educational opportunities for learners and families throughout the Pike Road community.
