"Fall is a busy season in the Town of Pike Road, and we have many things to look forward to.

First, I would like to remind every citizen that, on Oct. 5, there will be an important vote on a proposal to raise the revenue to build a new high school in the Town of Pike Road. The Pike Road Schools Board of Education has analyzed the needs and projected the costs of construction. As a result, the school board is recommending the proposed property tax referendum. By adopting this proposal, the school will have the resources in place to continue the path forward for public education. The school has engaged professionals and developed this plan focused on meeting student needs. The action used to develop this proposal follows the same strategic thought pattern that has been applied since the initial days of the Town. As mayor, I understand the value of education, and I will be voting for the proposal. Likewise, the Town Council voted unanimously in support of a resolution endorsing the proposal. Education is an important part of Pike Road, and voting for this proposal helps provide critical infrastructure for our schools.

Together, we have a responsibility to make smart decisions that keep both our families and our community safe and healthy. 

Community Updates & Reminders from the Town of Road Regarding COVID-19

Pike Road, ALA – On Tuesday, July 6, 2021, the statewide Safer Apart Order and state of emergency (previously implemented and declared by State Health Officer Scott Harris and Governor Kay Ivey) both ended. However, the need for each of us to take safety precautions and make responsible decisions with regards to COVID-19 continues. This includes wearing a mask around those outside of your household, frequent hand washing, practicing social distancing, and covering coughs and sneezes. One of the most effective tools to combat COVID-19 continues to be vaccination. Vaccines are free and readily available at multiple locations within our community, and individuals ages 12+ are eligible to receive the vaccine. Town Hall and all municipal facilities are open to public access. Effective August 9, 2021, visitors to all municipal facilities are required to wear masks or face coverings. If you do not have a mask, we will have one available for you. We continue to encourage visitors and



members of the Town of Pike Road team to practice safety precautions and exercise personal responsibility. This policy includes Town Hall, Founders Station and the Pike Road Arts Center. Municipal services continue to be accessible via phone and email, and we encourage you to make an appointment if you need to meet with a member of our team. - Events at municipal facilities are being assessed on a case-by-case basis, and events scheduled for the coming months are being evaluated. However, we will continue to offer a variety of virtual and blended events through our ENHANCE initiative, and we look forward to more traditional events as we move forward. Based on facility availability and guidance from ADPH, municipal facilities will soon transition to be available for public use.
- The Recycling Depot is open for recycling drop-off three days per week: It will open at 8 a.m. on Tuesdays and remain open until 5 p.m. on Thursdays. This schedule is subject to change based on the safety requirements of the ongoing COVID-19 challenge, and we ask that you utilize the Recycling Depot respectfully and with consideration for the Town of Pike Road team that maintains it.

Any changes or updates to this policy will be based primarily on CDC and ADPH recommendations. Citizens will be notified via our enewsletter and normal communications methods, including Facebook, Instagram and Twitter.
