The 1863 Emancipation Proclamation and the following actions, leading to the 1865 emancipation of enslaved persons in Texas, forever changed the lives of Americans and reset the course of our country. The Town of Pike Road is pleased to recognize this national holiday.

The coming weeks are full of activity, and we are excited to invite the community to join us for SummerFest, a family-friendly fireworks show on Thursday, July 1! Parking will begin at 6 p.m. at Rolling Hills Park and Cottonwood Golf Club, and our family-friendly area with kids' activities will be open from 6:30 – 8:30 p.m. at Rolling Hills Park. This includes food available from local food trucks, inflatables, and music. Lawn chairs and picnics are welcome, but no tents or alcoholic beverages are permitted. 

Spotlight On Safety: Project Lifesaver & Other Community Programs from the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office



Building safer communities is a priority of the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office (MCSO). On Tuesdays in June, we are happy to present "Tuesday Tips with the MCSO," a summer video series sharing how YOU can participate in and benefit from community safety programs provided by our local Sheriff's Office. Project Lifesaver is a search and rescue program operated by the MCSO and public safety agencies across the country. The program targets at-risk individuals who are prone to wandering away from their safe environment. The program is designed to reduce potential injury of adults and children with the propensity to wander due to Alzheimer's, dementia, autism, or other cognitive diseases. The MCSO Project Lifesaver is committed to assisting the community and keeping your loved ones safe!

Through multi-agency collaboration, the MCSO issues state-of-the-art, personalized radio transmitting bracelets to any resident with a memory-impairing illness. The MCSO is the primary agency listed on the bracelets, and the bracelet also contain a personal pin number registered to the individual who wears it. When wandering individuals are found, those assisting will know to contact the MCSO, and the Sheriff's Office will notify caregivers of their loved one's location. We are so appreciative of the partners who help

make this possible across the country: There have been incidents when a person has wandered to another state!
