UPDATED STATEWIDE COVID-19 HEALTH ORDER FOR ALABAMA

STAY AT HOME Expired on April 30, 2020 at 5 p.m.

STAY AT HOME ORDER:

INDIVIDUALS

Ordered to stay at home except to meet basic needs

EMPLOYERS

Businesses *closed* except for those that meet a critical need or pose a minimal risk; sanitation and social-distancing rules and guidelines for remaining businesses

DETAIL STODES

Essential retail stores open subject to 50% occupancy rate, social-distancing and sanitation rules

BEACHES

Closed for all purposes

MEDICAL PROCEDURES

Postponed except for those deemed "necessary" under various criteria as determined

NON-WORK GATHERINGS

Limited to fewer than 10 persons with 6 feet of distance between persons. "Drive-in" gatherings permitted if participants stay in cars with people from their own households.

SENIOR CITIZEN CENTERS

Regular programming suspended except meals available through curbside pick-up or delivery

EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS

Closed to in-person instruction (except for daytime special activities programs)

CHILD DAY CARE FACILITIES

Must not allow 12 or more children in a room

HOSPITALS AND NURSING HOMES

Must implement policies to restrict visitation

RESTAURANTS. BARS AND BREWERIES

Limited to take-out, curbside or delivery

CLOSED

- Entertainment venues (such as night clubs, theaters, bowling alleys)
- Athletic facilities and activities (such as fitness centers and commercial gyms)
- Close-contact service providers (such as barber shops, hair salons, nail salons, tattoo services)

EXTENDED SAFER AT HOME

The Safer at Home order extends until April 9, 2021 at 5 p.m.

SAFER APART Goal

MORE UPDATES COMING SOON AS WE CONTINUE TO MONITOR THE COVID-19 SITUATION

WHAT'S NEW:

HOSPITALS AND NURSING HOMES

Subject to reasonable restrictions, patients and residents will be allowed visits from as many as two caregivers (up from one) or as many as two visitors (up from one) at a time

SENIOR CITIZEN CENTERS

Programs other than congregate meals may resume, but only outdoors and subject to guidelines by the Alabama Department of Senior Services. Meals still available by curbside pick-up or delivery

RESTAURANTS, BARS AND BREWERIES

Still may open, but with no limit on party size at tables. Still required: Partitions or 6 feet between tables and additional sanitation rules and guidelines

SUMMER CAMP

Still may open subject to social-distancing and sanitation rules and guidelines. The social-distancing requirement was changed to mirror the one used for schools.

WHAT'S STAYING THE SAME:

MASK

Masks required in public when interacting within 6 feet with people of another household, subject to certain exceptions. Masks required in schools and colleges, where possible, for employees and students in second grade and above.

ENTERTAINMENT VENUES (SUCH AS ARCADES, THEATERS, BOWLING ALLEYS)

May open subject to social-distancing and sanitation rules and guidelines

ATHLETIC ACTIVITIES

Allowed subject to social-distancing and sanitation rules and guidelines

EDUCATIONAL INSTITUTIONS

May open subject to social-distancing and sanitation rules and guidelines

CHILD DAY CARE FACILITIES

May open subject to social-distancing and sanitation rules and guidelines

INDIVIDUALS

Encouraged to stay home and follow good sanitation practices

EMPLOYE

Businesses may open subject to sanitation and social-distancing guidelines

RETAIL STORES

Subject to social-distancing and sanitation rules

MEDICAL PROCEDURES

Allowed unless prohibited in the future by the State Health Officer to preserve resources necessary to diagnose and treat COVID-19; providers must follow COVID-19-related rules and guidance from state regulatory boards or public health authorities

NON-WORK GATHERINGS

Still required to maintain 6 feet of distance between persons not from same household

ATHLETIC FACILITIES (SUCH AS FITNESS CENTERS AND COMMERCIAL GYMS)

Athletic facilities may open subject to social-distancing and sanitation rules and guidelines. Partitions allowed.

CLOSE-CONTACT SERVICE PROVIDERS

Close-contact service providers (such as barber shops, hair salons, nail salons, tattoo services) may open subject to social-distancing and sanitation rules and guidelines. Partitions allowed.

REACHES

Open with no limit on gatherings. Must maintain 6 feet of separation.
