

**Minutes of Pike Road Town Council Regular Meeting
Wednesday, October 22, 2025|7:00 AM
Pike Road Town Hall**

Mayor Stone called the meeting to order at 7:00 AM. Councilman Dunn opened the meeting in prayer. Mayor Stone led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Roll Call: Council members present were Angie Bradsher, Chris Dunn, Doug Fuhrman, and Rob Steindorff. A quorum was noted.

Consideration was given to the minutes for the regular council meeting on October 14, 2025. Councilman Dunn made a motion to accept the minutes as presented. Councilwoman Bradsher seconded. Unanimous consent was given. The minutes were accepted as presented.

Mayor Stone recognized the ENHANCE P.R.A.Y.E.R. Team for their hard work on the 2025 Summer Feeding Program that provided over 6000 units of food to approximately 2000 families throughout the Pike Road area. Mayor Stone also read a proclamation in their honor.

Denna Caro with Carr, Riggs & Ingram presented the report for **September 2025** (attached). The September statement shows that our available cash was \$16,748,965. Fund balance is \$17,181,351 which is \$650,501 more than last year. Our revenues YTD are \$11,971,393, which is \$935,896 more than the prior year. Our net income was \$632,561 at the month end. The ratio of income to expenses is 11%. The months of operating expenses on hand are at 28 months. Caro also reviewed several revenue categories.

Councilman Dunn made a motion to accept the financial statements for September 2025 as presented. Councilman Steindorff seconded. A unanimous vote was given. The financial statements were approved as presented.

Other Business

Mayor Stone noted that in other business he wanted to recognize and honor Councilman Chris Dunn for his service as a member of the Council of the Town of Pike Road for more than 20 years. Stone read a proclamation in his honor. Councilman Dunn was recognized for being a valuable leader working with the Planning Commission, Volunteer Fire Departments, school start-up, ENHANCE Initiative and many other critical aspects of the Town. Stone then presented it to him. There were comments from Chris Dunn showing his love for the town and gratitude for having been involved. Councilman Steindorff further acknowledged Councilman Dunn's dedication and leadership.

With no further business at hand, Councilman Dunn made a motion to adjourn at 7:27 AM. Councilwoman Bradsher seconded the motion. Unanimous consent was given. The meeting was adjourned.
