## Community Update from the Town of Pike Road Regarding COVID-19

Pike Road, ALA - The Town of Pike Road is in constant communication with county and state partners to monitor the novel (new) coronavirus (COVID-19) that is impacting many parts of the world, including the United States. We are also working with our emergency and service partners regarding their plans for continued operations. Our goal is to address citizens' concerns and communicate the steps that are being taken to mitigate the risks to our citizens. We want to help our community to be smart, be safe, and be confident in their actions.

The Town of Pike Road team is committed to providing safe access to municipal services, and that begins at Town Hall. Based on the CDC's recommendations of social distancing, we are limiting public access to the administrative areas of our facilities. We respectfully request that citizens limit their visits to Town Hall and handle municipal needs remotely. The Town of Pike Road will continue to function as normal, but our staff will be accessible primarily via phone and email. We will continue to respond with careful actions and cleaning to be sensitive to the concerns of citizens with appointments. At this time of year, business licenses and inspection requests make up a large portion of Town Hall traffic. In the interest of erring on the side of caution, the Town of Pike Road is suspending all events at municipal facilities, including Town Hall (9575 Vaughn Rd), Founders Station (4902 Pike Rd), and the Pike Road Arts Center (944 Wallahatchie Rd), effective immediately through March 30. Events following March 30 are being evaluated, and any changes or updates to this policy will be based primarily on CDC and ADPH recommendations. Citizens will be notified via our e-newsletter and normal communications methods, including Facebook, Instagram and Twitter.

The Town of Pike Road is in continuous contact with our emergency and utility service providers, who have plans in place to maintain continuity of service. In addition, Pike Road Schools has advised that they will make operational decisions based on the recommendations of the Alabama State Department of Education and ADPH.
