Fall and Winter Highlights

* Aug. 17: Pond Management Seminar

There are over 50,000 ponds in the State of Alabama, and men and women from across town attended Pond Management Seminar to learn how to maintain theirs! Dr. Chuck Wright of the Montgomery County Extension Service explained the different uses of ponds, from fishing and irrigating to landscape features, and the unique care each need. He also shared tips for creating fish habitats, and the variety of tools the Extension uses to create them.

* Sept. 20-21: Pike Road Patriots' First Varsity Homecoming Festivities

The theme of Pike Road Schools' first varsity Homecoming was "We've Waited Decades for This Night!" in honor of the rich educational history of our area and the years of work the community and Town leadership 4 put into creating the PRS system. The community celebrated this milestone with events leading up to the Homecoming game, a Patriot win against Bullock County.

* Sept. 20 – Community Pep Rally at Town Hall

The Community Pep Rally featured the Pike Road Schools Patriot football players, cheerleaders, show choir, and band! In the spirit of creating new traditions and connecting with the Pike Road area's past, Mayor Stone gifted a bell to the PRS Patriots. Historically, Ms. Georgia Washington rang a bell to welcome her students each day, and that bell is on display at the Georiga Washington campus, refurbished by former students. Now, the new bell rings with each Patriot touchdown and victory!

* Sept. 21 – Homecoming Parade at Georgia Washington School

During the first0ever Homecoming parade, Grades 8 – 11 paid tribute to the Pike Road community's

history by decorating floats to represent decades, including the '20s, '50s & '60s, '70s and '80s. Agricultural Science students, the Marching Band, Wrestling Team, Cheerleaders, Homecoming hopefuls and mascot, Victor E. Patriot, were among participants in the parade, which was bookended by two of our emergency service partners: the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office and the Pike Road Volunteer Fire Department.

* Sept. 21 - Homecoming Game @ ASU Stadium v. Bullock County

The Town of Pike Road community filled the stands of ASU's Hornet Stadium to support the Patriots in their first varsity Homecoming game. The band, cheerleaders, pep squad and Victor E. Patriot helped keep the energy up in the stands, and the Patriots pulled through with a 31-28 win over Bullock County. Homecoming hopefuls worked in the weeks before the game to raise \$13,000 for charities close to their hearts, and Kennedy Jones, who raised money for the Montgomery Area Food Bank, was crowned Homecoming Queen at halftime. The band performed the alma mater, transcribed by Band Director Patrick Darby based on a rendition by an alumnus of the Historic Pike Road School, after the game, another new tradition for Pike Road Schools.


* Nov. 18: Art Talk & Afternoon Tea feat. Carl Calderone






Administrative Updates



Pike Road Schools

It has been a great first half of the school year. We have grown to over 1,850 students. We have added a third school campus at Georgia Washington, started offering Advanced Placement courses through an A+ College Ready grant, began playing varsity sports.

While we were busy growing, we continued to work on learning. Pike Road Schools attained AdvancED system accreditation in 2018 with a very high score, earning accreditation through 2023. Our students and teachers continue to share with the rest of the state, leading the way in improving education through hosting walkthroughs for educators to see how we are teaching and learning. These walkthroughs are sponsored by A+, an Alabama group working to improve our schools. The Pike Road Way focuses on students taking responsibility for their own learning, and learning to think, innovate, and create. We are looking forward to the release of the state report card so everyone can see the effect that learner engagement is having on our students.

Our educators continue to be recognized as the best in the state, as evidenced by Britney Fureigh's selection as one of three finalists in Alabama for the Presidential Teaching Award in Math and Maria Franco's selection as one of three finalists in Alabama for the Presidential Teaching Award in Science. Natalie Tucker was selected as the Alabama Gifted Coordinator of the Year, and David Sikes has been selected as the District 3 principal of the year and is in the final three for possible selection as the Alabama Principal of the Year.

We are excited about the renovations that are getting underway in the Georgia Washington Campus. The building will be a special place when the work is complete, and we are proud to rework and continue the use of a building and a site that has educated so many people over the last seven decades. It is an honor to preserve the legacy of Ms. Washington and see it continued into future generations.

We hope to be responsible stewards of all we have and to use it to make a difference around us and around the world. May you enjoy peace in this season and spread joy to all around you!


