Next Tuesday, Aug. 3, we hope you will join us to say "thank you" and get to know our safety partners as the Montgomery County Sheriff's Office and Sheriff Derrick Cunningham host National Night Out. Stop by Home Depot on Chantilly Parkway from 5-8 p.m. for a free evening of family-friendly fun, food, and fellowship with our local law enforcement partners and emergency responders. This is also a great opportunity to learn about the programs offered by the MCSO that can help keep you, your home, your business, and our community safe!

As summer comes to a close, we hope you continue to enjoy all the opportunities we have in our area to get outside, get together, and connect with one another. We also encourage you to do so safely and thoughtfully. COVID-19 and, particularly, the Delta variant, are still active across Alabama, and it is up to each of us to make smart, responsible decisions that help us maintain our forward progress in the fight to stop it.

We also want to remind you that the COVID-19 vaccines are an excellent tool to help protect ourselves, our families, and our community, and we encourage you to explore opportunities to receive a vaccine. In Alabama, individuals ages 12+ are now eligible to receive the vaccine. We are pleased to share two vaccination clinics in our area this weekend:

- Murdock Chapel AME Church, located on Antioch Road, has partnered with Baptist Health to host a free community vaccine clinic. Individuals can receive their first dose from 9 a.m. 12 p.m. on July 31, and second doses will be available on August 21. Click here to learn more about this clinic from Baptist Health.
- The Montgomery City/County EMA has partnered to provide a free community vaccine clinic at the Alabama National Fair Grounds inside Garrett Coliseum. Individuals can receive their first dose from 8 a.m. 7 p.m. on July 31 and from 1 7 p.m. on Aug. 1. Second doses will be available on August 22 23, and when you return for your second dose, you will receive free tickets to the fair! Click here to learn more from our local EMA.

Community Updates & Reminders from the Town of Pike Road Regarding COVID-19

Pike Road, ALA – On May 3, 2021, Governor Kay Ivey announced the new Safer Apart Order. This order updates the required COVID-19 precautions and encourages each of us to exercise our personal responsibility and make safe choices that help keep our community healthy. The Safer Apart Order continues through July 6, 2021. To learn more about this order, please click here. Based on the current Safer At Home order and recommendations of social distancing, the following policies and procedures will apply in the Town of Pike Road:

- Town Hall and all municipal facilities are open to public access. Face coverings are no longer required in municipal buildings, but we continue to encourage visitors and members of the Town of Pike Road team to practice safety precautions and exercise personal responsibility. Face masks will continue to be available upon request. This policy includes Founders Station and the Pike Road Arts Center. Municipal services continue to be accessible via phone and email, and we encourage you to make an appointment if you need to meet with a member of our team. - Events at municipal facilities are being assessed on a case-by-case basis, and events scheduled for the coming months are being evaluated. However, we will continue to offer a variety of virtual events through our ENHANCE initiative, and we look forward to more traditional events as we move forward. Based on facility availability and guidance from ADPH, municipal facilities will soon transition to be available for public use.
- The Recycling Depot is open for recycling drop-off three days per week: It will open at 8 a.m. on Tuesdays and remain open until 5 p.m. on Thursdays. This schedule is subject to change based on the safety requirements of the ongoing COVID-19 challenge, and we ask that you utilize the Recycling Depot respectfully and with consideration for the Town of Pike Road team that maintains it.

Any changes or updates to this policy will be based primarily on CDC and ADPH recommendations.
